REAL is a police and student-led group that specializes in drama based on current teen issues. At this event, REAL will perform the drama "Twisted".

Twisted, is a drama written and produced locally by James Henwood from Courtice Secondary School which focuses on bullying and family based issues from the youth perspective. Teens and adults will benefit from the insights and the thought-provoking nature of this production.
